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Assurance Report on Use of Proceeds from 2024 Blue Bond Issuance of China Construction Bank London Branch

To the China Construction Bank London Branch

We have been engaged by China Construction Bank London Branch (the “Bank”) to perform a limited assurance engagement, as defined by International Standards on Assurance Engagements, here after referred to as the engagement, to report on the Bank’s use of proceeds from London Branch’s 2024 Blue Bond issuance (the “Subject Matter”), which comprise the Statement on the proceeds raised from the issuance of London Branch’s 2024 Blue Bond as of 31 December 2024 in the accompanying the Appendix A and the Statement on the disbursements of the proceeds from the issuance of London Branch’s 2024 Blue Bond as of 31 December 2024 in the accompanying Appendix B.

Criteria applied by the Bank

In preparing the use of proceeds from London Branch’s 2024 Blue Bond issuance in the Appendix A and Appendix B, the Bank applied *the Green Bond Principles 2021* published by the International Capital Market Association and *Bonds to Finance the Sustainable Blue Economy* published by International Capital Market Association together with International Finance Corporation, United Nations Global Compact, United Nations Environment Programme Finance Initiative, and the Asian Development Bank (the “Criteria”).

The Bank’s Responsibility

The Bank’s management is responsible for selecting the Criteria, and for presenting the use of proceeds from London Branch’s 2024 Blue Bond issuance in accordance with that Criteria, in all material respects. This responsibility includes establishing and maintaining internal controls, maintaining adequate records and making estimates that are relevant to the preparation of the subject matter, such that it is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Assurance Practitioner’s Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the presentation of the Subject Matter based on the evidence we have obtained.

We conducted our engagement in accordance with *International Standard for Assurance Engagements Other than Audits or Reviews of Historical Financial Information* ('ISAE 3000 (Revised)'). The standard require that we plan and perform our engagement to express a conclusion on whether we are aware of any material modifications that need to be made to the Subject Matter in order for it to be in accordance with the Criteria, and to issue a report. The nature, timing, and extent of the procedures selected depend on our judgment, including an assessment of the risk of material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

We believe that the evidence obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our limited assurance conclusions.

Our Independence and Quality Management

We have maintained our independence and confirm that we have met the requirements of the *Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants* issued by the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants, and have the required competencies and experience to conduct this assurance engagement.

EY also applies International Standard on Quality Management 1: *Quality Management for Firms that Perform Audits or Reviews of Financial Statements, or Other Assurance or Related Services Engagements*, which requires that we design, implement and operate a system of quality management including policies or procedures regarding compliance with ethical requirements, professional standards and applicable legal and regulatory requirements.

Description of Procedures performed

Procedures performed in a limited assurance engagement vary in nature and timing from, and are less in extent than for a reasonable assurance engagement. Consequently the level of assurance obtained in a limited assurance engagement is substantially lower than the assurance that would have been obtained had a reasonable assurance engagement been performed. Our procedures were designed to obtain a limited level of assurance on which to base our conclusion and do not provide all the evidence that would be required to provide a reasonable level of assurance.

Although we considered the effectiveness of management's internal controls when determining the nature and extent of our procedures, our assurance engagement was not designed to provide assurance on internal controls. Our procedures did not include testing controls or performing procedures relating to checking aggregation or calculation of data within IT systems.

A limited assurance engagement consists of making enquiries, primarily of persons responsible for preparing the use of proceeds from London Branch's 2024 Blue Bond issuance and related information, and applying analytical and other appropriate procedures.

Our procedures included:

- Conducted interviews with personnel to understand the business and reporting process;
- Conducted interviews with key personnel to understand the process for collecting, collating and reporting the subject matter;
- Checked the Bank's policies and procedures in relation to the subject matter;
- Checked the register of use of proceeds from the Bank's 2024 Blue Bond Issuance maintained by the relevant department;
- Tested, on a sample basis, underlying source information to check the accuracy of the data.


We also performed such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

Conclusion

Based on our procedures and the evidence obtained, we are not aware of any material modifications that should be made to the use of proceeds from London Branch's 2024 Blue Bond Issuance as of 31 December 2024 in the Appendix A and Appendix B, in order for it to be in accordance with the Criteria.

Appendix A

Statement on the proceeds from the issuance of London Branch's 2024 Blue Bond as of 31 December 2024

In accordance with the *Green Bond Principles 2021* published by the International Capital Market Association, and *Bonds to Finance the Sustainable Blue Economy* published by International Capital Market Association together with International Finance Corporation, United Nations Global Compact, United Nations Environment Programme Finance Initiative, and the Asian Development Bank, we provide an account of the CNY 2,000.00 million raised by China Construction Bank Corporation London Branch (hereinafter referred to as "CCB" or "the Bank") from the issuance of the London Branch's 2024 Blue Bond filed on 9 July 2024 (the "Blue Bond") as follow:

1. CCB issued the Blue Bond amounting to CNY 2,000.00 million on 9 July 2024, the proceeds were received on 16 July 2024, equivalent to CNY 1,998.00 million;
2. CCB constructed a special ledger for the accounting and proper management of the Blue Bond, including the record of funds received from bond issuance, as well as the disbursements and subsequent recovery of funds, so as to ensure that funds raised are specifically used as intended, solely for eligible projects over the duration of the Blue Bond .
3. Management of CCB is responsible for the preparation of the Statement detailing how funds raised from the issuance of the Blue Bond had been utilized as set out in Appendix B, including the completeness, accuracy and validity of the information contained in the Statement.
4. Management of CCB declared that as of 31 December 2024, CNY 2,000.00 million had been raised from the issuance of the Blue Bond, all had been disbursed to the Eligible Green Projects, in accordance with the *Green Bond Principles 2021*, *Bonds to Finance the Sustainable Blue Economy* and *China Construction Bank Green, Social, Sustainability and Sustainability-Linked ("GSSS") Bond Framework*.
